- Follows a successful race in 2022, after no events in 2020 & 2021 due to Covid
- Entry fee raised from £12 & £14 to £15 & £17 to cover higher costs
- Weather perfect again. Mild & cloudy with sunny intervals. Dry conditions
- 224 entrants (234 last year)
- 187 finishers and 1 DNF (188 & 3 last year). 16% no-shows (18% last year)




